John 11:45 Then many of the Jews who had come to Mary, and had seen the things Jesus did, believed in Him. **46** But some of them went away to the Pharisees and told them the things Jesus did. **47** Then the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered a council and said, “What shall we do? For this Man works many signs. **48** If we let Him alone like this, everyone will believe in Him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and nation.”

49 And one of them, Caiaphas, being high priest that year, said to them, “You know nothing at all, **50** nor do you consider that it is expedient for us that one man should die for the people, and not that the whole nation should perish.” **51** Now this he did not say on his own authority; but being high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus would die for the nation, **52** and not for that nation only, but also that He would gather together in one the children of God who were scattered abroad.

53 Then, from that day on, they plotted to put Him to death.

54 Therefore Jesus no longer walked openly among the Jews, but went from there into the country near the wilderness, to a city called Ephraim, and there remained with His disciples.

DEATH & ATONEMENT

How He died is important | Why He died is infinitely more important

Key Ideas: Substitutionary

- **Person:**
 - **2 Corinthians 5:21** For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.
- **Extent:**
 - **1 John 2:2** And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world.
 - **Romans 6:10** For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God.
 - **Hebrews 7:27** who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the people's, for this He did once for all when He offered up Himself.
 - **Hebrews 9:12** Not with the blood of goats and calves, but with His own blood He entered the Most Holy Place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption.
 - **Hebrews 10:10** By that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Key Ideas: Substitutionary

- **Application:**
 - **Romans 4:1** What then shall we say that Abraham our father has found according to the flesh? **2** For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. **3** For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness." **4** Now to him who works, the wages are not counted as grace but as debt. **5** But to him who does not work but believes on Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is accounted for righteousness, **6** just as David also describes the blessedness of the man to whom God imputes righteousness apart from works: **7** "Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, And whose sins are covered; **8** Blessed is the man to whom the LORD shall not impute sin."
 - **1 John 1:7** But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin.

RESURRECTION (1 Corinthians 15)

RESURRECTION

Old Testament Idea, Not A New Testament Idea

- **Job 19:25** For I know that my Redeemer lives, And He shall stand at last on the earth; **26** And after my skin is destroyed, this I know, That in my flesh I shall see God, **27** Whom I shall see for myself, And my eyes shall behold, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!
- **Psalms 16:10** For You will not leave my soul in Sheol, Nor will You allow Your Holy One to see corruption.
- **Hebrews 11:17** By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises offered up his only begotten son, **18** of whom it was said, "In Isaac your seed shall be called," **19** concluding that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead, from which he also received him in a figurative sense.
- **Exodus 3:6** Moreover He said, "I am the God of your father—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look upon God.
- **Genesis 25:8** Then Abraham breathed his last and died in a good old age, an old man and full of years, and **was gathered to his people**.
- **Daniel 12:13** "But you, go your way till the end; for you shall rest, and will arise to your inheritance at the end of the days.

ADDITIONAL IDEAS ON THE RESURRECTION

- **Romans 1:4** and declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead.
- **Romans 4:25** who was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our **justification**.
- **1 Peter 1:3** Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has **begotten** us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,
- **Romans 8:31** What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? **32** He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things? **33** Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who **justifies**. **34** Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us.

ADDITIONAL IDEAS ON THE RESURRECTION

- **John 16:7** Nevertheless I tell you the truth. It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the **Helper** will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you.
- **John 20:19** Then, the same day at evening, being the **first day of the week**, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace be with you."
- **Romans 6:5** For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the **likeness** of His resurrection, **6** knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin. **7** For he who has died has been freed from sin. **8** Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, **9** knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more. Death no longer has dominion over Him. **10** For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God.
- **Acts 17:31** because He has appointed a day on which **He will judge the world** in righteousness by the Man whom He has ordained. He has given assurance of this to all by raising Him from the dead."

ASCENSION


- **John 20:17** Jesus said to her, "Do not cling to Me, for I have not yet ascended to My Father; but go to My brethren and say to them, 'I am ascending to My Father and your Father, and to My God and your God.'"
- **Hebrews 1:1** God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, **2** has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds; **3** who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, **4** having become so much better than the angels, as He has by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they.
- **1 Timothy 3:16** And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifested in the flesh, Justified in the Spirit, Seen by angels, Preached among the Gentiles, Believed on in the world, Received up in glory.
- **Revelation 3:21** To him who overcomes I will grant to sit with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne.
- **Acts 7:55** But he, being full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God, **56** and said, "Look! I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!"
- **Acts 13:33** God has fulfilled this for us their children, in that He has raised up Jesus. As it is also written in the second Psalm: 'You are My Son, Today I have begotten You.'




